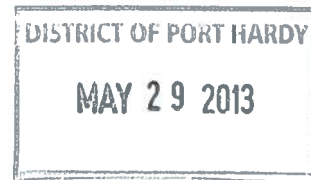

Jeff Long called the meeting to order at 12:03pm.

Jeff advised that a more formal format for the meetings of the Emergency Preparedness Committee has been established with agendas, minutes and ensuing action items for follow up.

**3. DELEGATIONS – None**

**4. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES**

**a) Sign Installation – Tsunami evacuation routes**

Jeff Long advised the Committee that the signs are being installed this week. B. McCorquodale asked if signage will be posted near the Quatse River Bridge, as this is a high hazard area. Jeff will contact T. Kushner, Director of Operational Services, to determine what specific signage is to be installed for this area/corridor.

**b) Tsunami Siren Warning Project**

The Committee was updated on the siren warning project and advised that quotes are still being obtained from various sources. Bob Hawkins discussed the types of sirens and the various options that are available. Discussion included the need for the supplier to do site evaluations, the different types of sirens and available options, testing schedules and possibility of obtaining the siren used at the Elk Falls Pulp Mill in Campbell River.

b) Tsunami Warning / Notification Methods

Tsunami warning methods for first responders and the public was discussed and the following sources of warning notifications were noted:

- i) West Coast and Alaska Tsunami Warning Centre ([wcatwc.arh.noaa.gov](http://wcatwc.arh.noaa.gov)): uses Twitter to send messages regarding warnings
- ii) U.S. Geological Survey ([earthquake.usgs.gov](http://earthquake.usgs.gov)): uses various methods to send real time notifications.
- iii) Earthquake Alert! Software download for android phones (also available for iPhone) at Google Play website at: <https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.joshclemm.android.quake&hl=en>

The Committee was advised that options regarding how messages are received (cell phone, email, text message) may be available from the various notification sites. Jeff Long advised that the District has contacted the Provincial Government regarding the lateness of warning notices that the District has experienced thus far from the Province, especially in comparison to the notices provided by US organizations like the West Coast and Alaska Tsunami Warning Centre.

c) Logistics Plan – Contract Tree

The need for a redundant emergency call out sheet for tsunami warning events has been identified and Jeff and Bob are to prepare a draft of same.

d) One Call Now

Bob Hawkins reviewed the commercially available One Call Now system and advised it could be set up for homes in specified areas, rather than for the whole town. Tofino currently uses the system for those in specific danger zones and there is a twenty minute start to finish time line for their system. Discussion included the setting up and maintenance of the data base, the annual and ongoing costs of the system, using it for different types of call outs, and type of call out (phone, text, email).

- a) Jeff will contact T. Kushner, Director of Operational Services, about Tsunami warning signage in the low lying Quatse River Bridge area which is a major thoroughfare from one part of the District to the other.
- b) Jeff Long and Bob Hawkins will work on a real time communication plan with the local radio station and newspaper
- c) Jeff and Bob to prepare Tsunami Warning Redundant Call Out Logistics Plan
- d) PDF of the HELP and OK signs be put on the District website for use by the public.
