POWER OUTAGES

During power outages, please reduce your water intake and sewage outflow.

→For the residences with low pressure sewer systems in the Storey's Beach area, it's definitely a good idea to reduce water usage and with it wastewater production. These individual sewage tanks have a limited capacity and depending on the number of occupants per residence during an extended power outage there could be a capacity issue. • Please note: When the power is out, there is no high level alarm on the units to notify the homeowner of the situation. •

RV PARKING TRAFFIC BYLAW 16-2007

- No person shall park an <u>unlicensed vehicle</u>, trailer or recreational vehicle on public highways where parking is otherwise permitted.
- No trailer, including a holiday trailer or boat trailer, shall be parked on any street of the District, *unless it is attached to a vehicle capable of towing it.*
