In 2014 the District of Port Hardy entered into an agreement with Multi Material BC (Recycle BC) that added the ability for curbside recycling for single family residential dwellings in Port Hardy. The result of this was that the recycling and garbage pick ups would be on alternate weeks.

FROM APRIL 1 TO SEPTEMBER 30 ONLY RECREATIONAL FIRES ARE ALLOWED WITHIN THE DISTRICT OF PORT HARDY.

- NO OTHER BURNING IS PERMITTED
- All Provincial Fire Bans, effective within the Coastal Fire Centre, shall apply within the District boundaries.
- Port Hardy is NOT in the fog zone

Recreational Fire includes a campfire and means the burning of wood for recreational purposes in a permanent outdoor fireplace, barbecue or fire pit not larger than 60 centimetres in diameter that is designed and constructed to confine the fire and is suitable for such a purpose.
