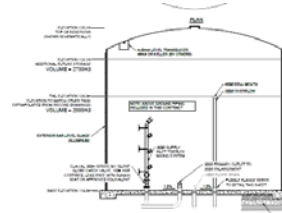

PROJECT UPDATE: WATERMAIN REPLACEMENT, NEW FORT RUPERT RESERVOIR & WATER TREATMENT PLANT RESERVOIR REPLACEMENT



- ◆ Five million dollar infrastructure improvement project is a joint venture project and cost shared between three levels of government. Federal Government (50%) Provincial Government (33%) and the Municipal District (17%).
- ◆ The project has been divided into two tenders. Contract 1 watermain and reservoir site preparations has been awarded to Island West Coast Excavation a Nanaimo based company, and contract 2 reservoirs construction has been awarded to H2Flow a Vancouver company.
- ◆ Some preliminary construction activities have already started, but heavy construction works are due to start on January 2nd 2018.
- ◆ Construction is expected to last 6 to 8 months, with an anticipated completion by July or August, 2018.
- ◆ The project will provide the District with improved water storage capabilities by adding an additional 2400 cubic meter of water storage capacity to the Districts distribution system. This is achieved by the means of a new 2000 cubic meter Reservoir at Fort Rupert and the 2700 cubic meter replacement reservoir at WTP.
- ◆ Much of additional capabilities are in the form of additional fire flow storage which will be conveyed via approximately 4000 meters of new and replacement upgraded water mains.
- ◆ The construction activities are expected to affect residences living or travelling along Fort Rupert Road, Byng Road, and Beaver Harbour Road, and all the water users on the District's water distribution system. All Port Hardy residents and First Nation communities are requested to conserve water and reduce their water consumption especially during the decommissioning and construction of the replacement reservoir at WTP site.
- ◆ This project is designed to eliminate fire flow deficiencies at three schools in the Storey's Beach area as well as the majority of the surrounding areas.



The District is very excited and looking forward to the completion of this project to be able to provide more efficient and improved service to the District citizens as well as our First Nation neighbouring communities.

**HOW CAN YOU HELP THE DISTRICT
IN SNOW REMOVAL OPERATIONS?**

- ◇ Expect minor delays after a snowfall and allow extra travel time.
- ◇ Please do your part to ensure safe road travel: use quality tires suitable for winter conditions, reduce your speed and travel only if necessary during and after major snowfalls.
- ◇ When approaching snow removal equipment give them plenty of room to operate.
- ◇ Please do not flag down operators to explain a point or request a favor, this slows down snow removal efforts. If you have questions or suggestions call Public Works at 250-949-7779.
- ◇ Please do not shovel snow from driveway or walkway into the street. This can cause safety issues if a vehicle hits this accumulation of snow and ice.
- ◇ Please park your vehicles in your driveway so the snow plow can clear the roadway in a neat and thorough manner.

**BOULEVARD MAINTENANCE
BYLAW 14-2005**

- Sec 4. Duty to Clean Sidewalks
- (a) An owner or occupier of real property shall:
 - i) remove snow or ice from a sidewalk or footpath bordering his real property by 10:00 am each day; and
 - ii) remove rubbish from a pedestrian facility bordering his real property by 10:00 am each day.
 - (b) An owner or occupier of real property shall remove snow, ice and rubbish from any roof or other part of any structure thereon adjacent to any portion of any high way or sidewalk if the snow, ice and rubbish constitute a hazard to person or property.
- Sec 5. Prohibitions No person shall:
- (a) use any corrosive materials for the removal of ice or snow on sidewalks
 - (b) willfully damage any boulevard or any tree, shrub, plant, bush or hedge on any boulevard;
 - (c) erect any sign, fence, wall or other structure on any boulevard, except with written permission of the Municipality;
 - (d) apply a pesticide to any boulevard; and
 - (e) dispose of any vegetation cuttings, rubbish, or discarded material or any liquid or solid waste on any boulevard or in any drainage facility.

**WINTER TIPS
FOR YOUR WATER LINES**

Winter conditions can bring problems with your water pipes. Frozen and burst pipes are inconvenient and expensive to repair. Act now to protect your property.



- ◆ Maintain low heat during the day, during the night and when away.
- ◆ Outside taps - insulate them or turn off and the lines.
- ◆ Home insurance - make sure you are covered for any emergency repairs.
- ◆ Locate and label your water shut off - located usually wherever the water pipe enters the premises.
- ◆ Install products made to insulate water pipes: "pipe sleeve" or installing UL-listed "heat tape," "heat cable," on exposed water pipes. Even a ¼" of newspaper can give protection in areas that do not have prolonged temperatures below freezing.

**SAVE ENERGY
AND STAY WARM THIS WINTER**



◆ Install a programmable thermostat and save up to 15 per % cent on your bill. Program it to 20° when you're home and 17° when out or asleep.

- ◆ Wear a sweater. It's way better Instead of cranking up the heat, put on a sweater. Not only will you feel cozy, it's another way to save money on your heating bills.
- ◆ Caulk the cracks and strip the gaps. If you have fixed, single pane windows, caulk the interior side where the sash meets the frame as well as where the trim meets the wall. For exterior doors and windows that open, use weather stripping where the two surfaces meet.
- ◆ Change the filter. Replace your furnace filter every three to six months; more if you smoke or have pets. It will help protect the furnace and prevent the fan motor from overheating.
- ◆ Insulate electrical switch plates on exterior walls with foam sealers to keep out drafts.
- ◆ If your windows are single pane, purchase inexpensive window film that attaches with double-sided tape to the interior frame and shrink with a blow dryer. The film acts as a second pane, helping to keep the drafts out and the heat in.
