CAT OWNERS THE ANIMAL CONTROL BYLAW APPLIES TO YOU TOO! PLEASE DO NOT LET YOUR CAT USE GARDENS AS A LITTER BOX

Every spring the District receives numerous calls about cats at large using people's gardens as litter boxes. The District does have an Animal Control Bylaw No. 11-2012 which prohibits animals from being at large in the municipality, including cats. While it may seem difficult to keep your cat(s) contained to your yard, the BC Centre of Disease Control has the following information regarding the parasite **toxoplasmosis gondii**.

Toxoplasmosis is a disease caused by the parasite *Toxoplasma gondii*, which can be found in garden soil and raw meat. Cats can get toxoplasma infection by killing and eating infected prey. The disease can also be passed on from cats to humans by contact with cat feces that contain *Toxoplasma* via:

- ◆ Cleaning cat litter boxes
- ◆ Working in gardens or playing in sandboxes that contain cat feces

Most people who are infected do not show any signs of the disease. Those who do get sick may experience flu like symptoms. Persons who are pregnant or have a weak immune system should follow HealthLink BC Guidelines.

How can you prevent getting **toxoplasmosis gondii**?

- ◆ wear gloves when cleaning the cat litter box, then wash your hands
- ◆ place a secure lid on your sandbox to prevent cats from using it as a litter box
- ◆ wear gloves when gardening, then wash your hands

**WINTER SNOWPLOWING
& SANDING

1. Hospital, Ambulance, Fire Hall, RCMP
2. School bus routes
3. Hills
4. Main streets and sidewalks
5. Side Streets, dead end roads & cul-de-sacs

A REMINDER ...the winter sanding and snow plowing season is upon us. *Please do not park vehicles (cars, trucks, trailers, boats etc.) basketball hoops or other equipment on District roadways as they interfere with plowing and sanding activities.*

**HOW CAN YOU HELP THE DISTRICT
IN SNOW REMOVAL OPERATIONS?**

- ◇ Expect minor delays after a snowfall and allow extra travel time.
- ◇ Please do your part to ensure safe road travel: use quality tires suitable for winter conditions, reduce your speed and travel only if necessary during and after major snowfalls.
- ◇ When approaching snow removal equipment give them plenty of room to operate.
- ◇ Please do not flag down operators to explain a point or request a favor, this slows down snow removal efforts. If you have questions or suggestions call Public Works at 250-949-7779.
- ◇ Please do not shovel snow from driveway or walkway into the street. This can cause safety issues if a vehicle hits this accumulation of snow and ice.
- ◇ Please park your vehicles in your driveway so the snow plow can clear the roadway in a neat and thorough manner.

REQUIRE A LICENSE
2019 DOG LICENSES ARE AVAILABLE
AT THE MUNICIPAL HALL
& FROM THE ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER**

- ◆ Fee for spayed or neutered: \$15.00
 - ◆ Fee for not spayed or not neutered: \$50.00
 - ◆ Non-licensed dogs = double fines at impoundment
- Remember: a dog tag is the fastest and best way to reunite you and your pet when one of you gets lost!*

2. Discuss concerns or questions with your local assessment office.
3. Request a formal review in writing by filing a written notice of complaint with the assessor by January 31 at 11:59 pm PST.

Sec 4. Duty to Clean Sidewalks

- (a) An owner or occupier of real property shall:
- i) remove snow or ice from a sidewalk or footpath bordering his real property by 10:00 am each day; and
 - ii) remove rubbish from a pedestrian facility bordering his real property by 10:00 am each day.
- (b) An owner or occupier of real property shall remove snow, ice and rubbish from any roof or other part of any structure thereon adjacent to any portion of any high way or sidewalk if the snow, ice and rubbish constitute a hazard to person or property.



Sec 5. Prohibitions No person shall:

- (a) use any corrosive materials for the removal of ice or snow on sidewalks
- (b) willfully damage any boulevard or any tree, shrub, plant, bush or hedge on any boulevard;
- (c) erect any sign, fence, wall or other structure on any boulevard, except with written permission of the Municipality;
- (d) apply a pesticide to any boulevard; and
- (e) dispose of any vegetation cuttings, rubbish, discarded material or any liquid or solid waste on any boulevard or in any drainage facility.

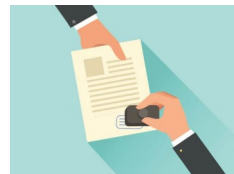
